AUDITION FAQ

Q: What's the age limit for the current RMES production?

A: Age limits vary per show. Please see the "Dates and Times" guide on the "Auditions" page for complete details.

Q: Can the audition piece be from any musical, or does it have to come from a Broadway musical?

A: Any musical (Excluding the show your auditioning for) would be fine. For a list of the most popular musical productions, please see the link to the right. <http://musicals.net/?shows=1>

Q: Are there any songs I should avoid singing at the auditions?

A: Yes. The directors would like everyone to avoid songs from the show. In addition to that, we also ask that you to avoid musical pieces that contain adult themes or language (Keep your vocal selection family friendly).

Q: I really want to audition for the show, but I have a conflict the same weekend that will prevent me from being able to attend all/most of the audition dates. Is there a way I can still audition for the production?

A: Yes, as the directors can arrange a private audition. Please contact us through the "Contact Us" page on the website **OR** message us through the Facebook event page (Link to that page is on the "Auditions" page). In your message, please state the reason why you will be unable to attend the main audition dates. These private auditions will be held prior to the main audition dates, and this option is only for those who absolutely cannot make the main audition dates.

Q: What if I can't make every rehearsal for the show?

A: The directors understand that not everyone will be able to attend every rehearsal, and that sometimes things unexpectedly happen which leads to one having to miss a rehearsal. Therefore, it's ok if you end up needing to miss a rehearsal once in a while. However, the directors ask that you list all known conflicts on your audition form to help us understand your general availability. Outside of the known conflicts, emergency absences will be handled on an individual basis.

Q: I can't read music. Does that mean I won't be cast in the show?

A: No. The directors realize that those auditioning for the show have a wide range of experience, and as such, rehearsals will be lead in a way that helps everyone involved.
